Let's Talk About Student Progress: Parents and Teachers will meet to discuss student progress on **Thursday, December 1 (1:00 – 3:30 pm & 5:30 – 7:30 pm)**. There will be no school for students on that day. Teachers, including specialists (French, music, band, resource, phys. ed., guidance, learning centre, EAL, etc.), will be available to meet with you to discuss your child's progress. Elementary teachers will meet in their classrooms with parents by appointment. Parents of elementary students have the opportunity to request appointment times with their child's teacher. Junior High teachers will meet with parents in the gymnasium on a first-come/first-served basis. Jr. High parents are encouraged to take advantage of the availability of afternoon meeting times when possible, as the evening tends to be busier. To accommodate all parents most appointments will be for ten minutes each. If more time is required to discuss your child's progress then a longer appointment can be made for another time. We look forward to seeing you. **Information (including appointment request forms) will be sent home with elementary students on November 21.**

Come to the Fair: Park West School is having a Scholastic Book Fair just in time for the holiday season. The dates of the fair are **Tuesday, November 29 to Thursday, December 1**. The Fair will be open during the day for students and their classes to view and make purchases, as well as any parents who would like to drop by. It will also be open for the afternoon and evening of Parent-Teacher Interview sessions on December 1. Books make great gifts and promote literacy. All profits from the Book Fair are used to purchase new books for our library. No Smoking: Smoking on or near school property is **against the law** in Nova Scotia. The Smoke Free Places Act of Nova Scotia prohibits smoking in enclosed places (including schools), and within 4 metres of windows, air intake vents and entrances. Furthermore, HRSB policy (Tobacco-Free Schools and Workplaces Policy A.006) prohibits the use of tobacco products in schools, on all school grounds, and within 4 metres of any school property. This policy also prohibits smoking in all vehicles while on school property, at all school-related events, on school trips, and by anyone transporting students to or from a school event, and while in the presence of students during those events. Thank you for your cooperation.

Early Entrance: If the weather is inclement (raining, storming or *extremely* cold) in the morning students will be invited to enter the school early (at 8:15 am), using their usual entrance doors. They will be sent directly to their classrooms to be supervised by teachers until classes begin at 8:25 am. **Students should only come inside the building early when given permission to do so.** Parents should only enter the building using the main doors and may not proceed to classrooms with their children.
